Greenwillow Grains near Tangent will provide a tour of their farm and discuss the joys and challenges of organic farming. Participants will tour the fields and the supporting ecosystem. April Hall Cutting of Wild Yeast Bakery, Corvallis, will talk about using these local grains in baking and will share some of her delicious bread. After the tour and discussion there will be a potluck picnic lunch under the apple trees.

Participants are asked to bring picnic food to share as well as eating utensils and perhaps a camp chair or blanket to picnic on. The tour is kid-friendly – there will be farm equipment to explore and there is space for Frisbee and hacky-sack, but no dogs, please.

Directions: Greenwillow Grains at Stalford Seed Farm is located at 32345 McLagan Rd, Tangent. From Highway 34, take Peoria Road south for almost 3 miles. Turn left onto Tangent Drive SW. Drive 3 miles straight east, and continue straight past Western Star Grange (on your left), across the railroad tracks and past the big seed warehouse on the right, to McLagan Road. Turn right on McLagan; the farm is about 1/2 mile on the left.
